

### **Mary Peters, Senior Advisor to ZHA, Former US Secretary of State for Transportation**

*Mary E. Peters is a senior adviser to Zachry American Infrastructure, a leading U.S.-owned infrastructure developer/ investor. Ms. Peters advises Zachry American and its partner Hastings Funds Management (USA) as the Zachry Hastings Alliance (ZHA) pursues and finances growth and development infrastructure projects in the transportation, energy, water, aviation and ports sectors. On behalf of ZHA, Ms. Peters educates public entities on the merits of partnering with private-sector developers and investors. Ms. Peters served as U.S. Secretary of Transportation from 2006 – 2009. In that role she led efforts to substantially improve transportation safety, to improve the performance of the nation's transportation system, and develop new policy and funding sources to support America's transportation system into the 21st Century. She had responsibility for oversight of the US aviation, surface and maritime policy and programs, including transportation agreements with foreign governments. As Secretary of Transportation, Ms. Peters was responsible for over 60,000 employees and a \$70.3 billion annual budget. Prior to serving as U.S. Secretary of Transportation, Ms. Peters was a Sr. Vice President and National Director for Transportation Policy and Consulting for HDR, Inc., a major engineering company. From 2001 – 2005 Ms. Peters served as the Federal Highway Administrator for the US Department of Transportation. In that position she had responsibility for the federal-aid and federal lands highway programs, including the interstate highway system and the national highway system. As Administrator, she was responsible for over 3,000 employees and a \$45 billion annual budget. During her tenure as FHWA Administrator, Ms. Peters worked with the Administration and Congress to enact a multi-year surface transportation bill, SAFETEA-LU. Ms. Peters served as the Arizona Department of Transportation Director prior to becoming Federal Highway Administrator.*

A registered professional engineer in New York, New Jersey and Connecticut, he is a member of numerous professional organizations such as the New York Building Foundation Board of Governors, Chairman of the Board of the New York Chapter of ACE, Chairman of the Board of The Regional Alliance, Member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, National Society of Professional*

Engineers and the Urban Land Institute. With more than 1,700 employees in 32 offices, STV is a leader in providing architectural, engineering, planning, environmental services and construction management for transportation systems, infrastructure, buildings and other facilities.
